Mothers Who Make is a grass roots international peer support network originating in London in 2014 with theatre maker Matilda Leyser and is now co-directed by Lizzy Humber. Dedicated to supporting mothers that hold the dual roles of mother and maker, there are currently 26 hubs, and the list is growing. Coventry's hub was founded by artists and mothers Jessica Timmis and Adele Reed in May, 2019 at The Herbert Art Gallery & Museum in the city centre and has attracted over 60 participants from all over the Midlands. This zine celebrates the hub so far and some of the varied themes discussed.

Every kind of **maker** is welcome - professional and/or passionate, working in any discipline and at any stage on their creative paths - writers, painters, performers, film makers, dancers, producers, musicians, crafters...

Children of any age are encouraged to attend too and are intergrated into hub meetings, for the dual roles of mother and artist are recognised and given equal value within all MWM events.


A living breathing miracle Giving all of yourself Again and again Day after day.
